Parish Letter June/July 2024

The General Election is just around the corner!

As I write this, the six-week race to Number 10 has begun and as you read this the days to vote are drawing near. So, how will you vote or WILL you vote?

At the announcement of the election, I heard one or two people say they wouldn't be voting as they didn't believe there was any party worth voting for! I also heard one or two members of rival political parties knocking the plans and deriding the visions of other parties - the games began.

Back in May, at the start of the political campaign the Archbishops of Canterbury and York called on the Country to PRAY. . . and take part. A statement was released inviting people to pray for the nation and to "think about how we all can play our part both as voters and, more broadly, as citizens".

"It is a time for us all — people of all faiths and of none — to ask important questions about what kind of country we want to be," they said.

"We are facing epic challenges both in our country and our world: from questions of war and peace to poverty and injustice and the very future of the Earth God has given us.

"Faced with such huge questions, our instinct as Christians is to turn to God in prayer and so we want to put prayer at the very heart of this campaign."

Archbishop Cottrell said he hoped that people would vote and that Christians would place their vote "based on what's going to be best for God's world".

The statement also included a plea for the run-up to the election, to be "marked by respect for one another, for good grace and a commitment to truth and integrity ... and ... even in the heat of the debate, we will treat each other with respect and kindness".

The <u>Archbishop of Wales</u>, the Most Revd. Andrew John, echoed their call for civility and urged "everyone to make full use of our democratic freedoms and to take part in the debates and the decisions which are before us".

The way God made a difference to humankind was to send his Son Jesus into the world to be a part of it. So, let's get involved for the right reasons and make a difference with our votes - praying over our political leaders, for wisdom and discernment and love!

PARISH COUNCIL

At the Annual Parish Meeting, on Monday, 20th May, the previous year's events of the P.C. and Community Groups were reviewed. Goalposts had been sourced for the Play Area and Cllr. Tracy Leese was thanked for forming a local girls' football team. The damaged Wirswall Road had been repaired—after a campaign of 9 years. A "Tommy" remembrance statue had been purchased for the community. The Village Hall committee were thanked for the various community lunches throughout the year. Representatives to the Pan Parish Highways Group, Police Cluster meetings and Whitchurch Joint Cemetery Board were agreed.

The Parish Council AGM followed.

Joe Briggs was re-elected as Chair, Fiona Wilson re-elected as Vice-Chair.

Councillors were thanked for their time given to Parish matters; Revd. Veronica was thanked for her contribution to the Parish Council.

The Neighbourhood Plan should be out for consultation in June.

A closer relationship with Wrenbury P.C. is underway; a representative from Wrenbury was present at the meeting. Marbury P.C. is already strongly represented in the Pan-Parish Highways group.

The possibility of moving the overhead power lines in the village was looked at; a representative from SPEN will return to the next meeting with detailed plans.

Residents are welcome to attend meetings; however, if you wish to speak at the meeting, please contact the Chair or the Clerk beforehand. Public speaking time is limited and only Councillors may take part in discussions/decisions. The next meeting will be on Monday, 8th July, 7.30 p.m. at the Village Hall.

With reference to the **UK CARE SECTOR**, we have been supplied with some Q & A points which may be helpful to some - many thanks to Angela Gifford of Able Community Care.

Q - What is a Deferred Payment Agreement?

A – A Deferred Payment Agreement (DPA) is meant to ensure you are not forced to sell your home in your lifetime if you need to pay for residential care. By entering into a DFA, you delay paying your care costs until a later date, usually by having a legal charge placed on your property by the local Council. The cost of your care will then be repaid by you or your estate.

Many families are then able to rent the property out if they so wish or sell at a later date. As this is a loan, agreed interest and charges are added to the cost of your care fees, which are paid on your behalf by your local Council, whom you can contact for further details.

Q – How can you find out if in an earlier working life, one or more contributions were made to a pension scheme, details of which might have been forgotten?

A – Visit Gov.UK Pension Tracing Service where it advises that there is over £400 million in unclaimed pension savings. The Pension Tracing Service is a free government service. It searches a database of more than 200,000 workplace and personal pension schemes to try to find the contact details you need.

You can contact an adviser through our national phone service:

Relay UK - if you can't hear or speak on the phone, you can type what you want to say: 18001 then the Adviceline or Advicelink number

You can use Relay UK with an app or a textphone. There's no extra charge to use it. <u>Find out how to use Relay UK on the Relay UK website</u>.

Adviceline's available 9am to 5pm, Monday to Friday. It's usually busiest at the beginning and end of the day. It's not available on public holidays.

If you call from a mobile, we'll ask you to enter a local landline number on your keypad. This can be any number - we only use it to send your call to a local adviser if one is available.
