## **Keeping Positive**

St Paul writes in one of his letters to the church: "When I came to you, I did not come with eloquence or human wisdom...I came to you in weakness with great fear and trembling. My message wasn't in 'my' wisdom and persuasive words, but with a demonstration of the Spirit's power, so that your faith might not rest on human wisdom, but on God's power." This gives me hope, not only in my human weakness and failures but in others too.

When world leaders announce their intentions to better their own nations, when pride surpasses a love of inclusion and equality, when lessons from the past are failing to be learned as we look to the future, when things beyond our control cause us to drop our heads in despair because we didn't plan this for our ourselves or our loved ones - then do we simply give up?

NO, NO, NO!

Winston Churchill said, "Success is stumbling from failure to failure with no loss of enthusiasm". I like that, it reminds me that success is not the opposite of failure but perhaps more a result of accepting it, embracing it, recognising our weaknesses and then turning to God and leaning on Him. Great leaders are few and far between, but there is One who is constant, who has been there from the beginning and will be there at the end and remains with us through all the times in between and if you haven't recognised Him yet, then perhaps, just perhaps this is the year to do it!

The greatest failure in history could be perceived to be The Cross, the moment the Son of God was nailed to it and died, but out of that perceived failure came the most amazing and miraculous success, the resurrection, the proof that even death can be beaten. God's ultimate weapon is Love, that is His Power, and The Cross is where He demonstrated that Love and Power for all mankind.

Want to follow a leader that can turn your failures into victories? Then make a new resolution, find time to consider the options: going it alone or going with God?

St Paul tried both and opted for the latter, laying down belief in himself and taking up belief in the One who's Love and Power and Word, never fails.

#### PARISH ELECTORAL ROLL

This year will see the complete six-yearly revision of our Parish Electoral Roll. PLEASE NOTE that even if you are on the Electoral Roll at present <u>you will need to</u> re-apply to be included on the new Roll.

The Government's Electoral Register, or Roll, and the Parish Electoral Roll are two very different things. In order to vote in national or local elections you have to register through the Government website or complete the appropriate form. The Parish Electoral Roll is a list of the names and addresses of everyone who can vote in the Annual Parochial Church Meeting, which this year will be held on Sunday 13<sup>th</sup> April. You qualify to be on the Parish Electoral Roll in the following ways:-

You have been baptised, and are 16 or over

You live in the parish or - if you live outside the parish - have worshipped regularly at St. Michael's for at least six months unless illness has prevented you doing so

You are a lay person (not ordained)

You are a member of the Church of England (or certain other churches)

You can be on more than one Electoral Roll (for example, if you live in one parish but worship in another) but you have to choose which parish you wish to vote in.

The main Roll (with full names, addresses, phone numbers and email details) is confidential to the Vicar and the ER Officer only. The Roll which is displayed in the Church Porch for 15 days before the Annual Meeting shows only the <u>names</u> of those who have registered (no new names can be added during this period).

Application forms are available from our Electoral Roll Officer Janet Wheeler (01948 665981), from Carol Sheard (01948 663087), or from 15<sup>th</sup> February at the back of Church. Janet, Carol or Rev'd Veronica will be pleased to let you have more information. Completed forms should be returned to Janet by **28<sup>th</sup> March at the latest** - The Old Smithy, Marbury, Whitchurch SY13 4LS.

#### PARISH COUNCIL

The meeting on 11th November heard of ongoing concerns about parking on the pavement outside The Swan, causing danger to pedestrians. The P.C. will liaise further with the police, Highways, and The Swan to find a solution.

After the damage to the oak tree on The Green, a safety inspection was requested from Highways; the response is that the tree is healthy and will be reviewed as necessary.

The response from C.E. regarding safety on the A49 at Bradeley Green was agreed to be unacceptable; further response has been requested.

A request for more grit boxes was made.

The P.C. agreed to continue contributing towards the cost of the Parish Magazine.

A Defibrillator/Emergency Aid course will be arranged for the springtime.

#### MEETING OF PARISHIONERS & ANNUAL PAROCHIAL CHURCH MEETING

Please make a note in your diaries that the Meeting of Parishioners (when Churchwardens are elected) and St. Michael's APCM will be held in Church immediately following the Palm Sunday service on Sunday 13th April. The service will start earlier than usual at 10.30 am so the Meeting of Parishioners will begin at about 11.30. Anyone who is on the Government electoral roll for the Parish and those on the Church Electoral Roll are entitled to attend and vote at the Meeting of Parishioners. The APCM will immediately follow this at about 11.45 am, and although everyone is welcome to attend, only those on the Electoral Roll of St. Michael's are entitled to vote on the matters discussed. We're required to prepare a completely new Church Electoral Roll this year and details are given elsewhere in this magazine. Nominations to fill vacancies of those retiring from the PCC by rotation are also voted on at this meeting - this year, three members are retiring by rotation, and we have an additional vacancy for the period to April 2026. PCC members are required to be Communicant members of the Church, and the term of office is three years.
